

STUDIOS ON THE PARK FOUNDER: ANNE LADDON BIOGRAPHY

Vibrant! Lustrous! Alive! Bright!. These are words used by most people to describe the paintings by artist Anne Laddon. One woman who has several in her home says they make her feel happy; they add “singing” colors to her life.

Ms. Laddon graduated in 1966 from Occidental College in Los Angeles with a bachelor’s degree in art history and philosophy. She continued her studies in the master’s program in art history and aesthetics at UCLA in 1968.

Her early career included Art Director for a San Francisco based advertising agency, a freelance artist in advertising and copy before establishing her own graphics firm specializing in silk screen.

Ms. Laddon has traveled throughout the world, including an eight month safari in Africa, and photographic and painting excursions to South America, Europe, Canada Greece, Thailand, Laos and Mexico, her favorite location. She has also participated in a myriad of plein air festivals and competitions across the United States.

In 1974, Ms. Laddon became a founding member of the Torpedo Factory Art Center in Alexandria, Virginia and designed both the interior and exterior graphics for the building. Today, over 30 years later, the Torpedo Factory houses over 160 working artists and has become a successful magnet for the one million locals and tourists who visit there each year.

Ms. Laddon moved to San Luis Obispo County 24 years ago, married local rancher Jim Irving and together they have two grown children.”.

She relates that for a few years, her art took a backseat to her family. “As I raised our two children in a fairly remote location, dragging them back and forth to school, I often painted outside from the back of my car at the local middle school.”

“About 14 years ago, I came up with the idea that I needed to start painting ‘the neighborhood’, meaning the beautiful rolling hills, the vineyards and the hay fields that were on the road between our ranch and the kid’s schools. I’ve fallen in love with the North County landscape and architecture. I’ve painted most of the old classic buildings: Templeton Feed and Grain, the old Tribune Building, the bathhouse in downtown Paso, the Fremont Theatre in San Luis Obispo and may of our local restaurants.”

However, she admits to a certain amount of frustration. "I have thought over the last several years that Paso Robles and the North County have an incredible number of talented accomplished artists but there was no place for us to share our passion for the arts with the community."

Ms. Laddon long dreamed of using her experience and knowledge from the success of The Torpedo Factory to spearhead a similar art venue on the Central Coast.

In May of 2007, while sitting on a bench in the downtown park, she lifted her head and spied a "For Lease" sign in the old Pioneer Auto Parts building and knew that this was the ideal and only location that could make her dream of an artist workshop/art gallery come to fruition.

Local real estate developer Newlin Hastings comments that "many of us in the real estate business had been anxious to do something with this building on the park for over 25 years but owner Steve Encell wasn't motivated by any of the offers."

For seven months, Ms. Laddon and Mr. Encell talked and he became increasingly interested in leasing his building to the non profit organization "Studios on the Park" that Anne had described to him with her trademark enthusiasm and the pent up passion of years. "We were both laughing about this very idea that I was just an artist and he was just an auto parts salesman and here we were trying to come together on a complex agreement for his property, this choice location in downtown Paso Robles." In December of 2007, a deal was completed. At last, the arts community will have a major presence in Paso Robles.

The one story existing building is currently being renovated and will result in what is being called Prelude: Studios On the Park. It will open in late Spring 2009 at 1130 Pine Street. In addition to artists' workshops, it will contain classrooms and exhibits. Future plans include a complete rebuilding of the structure as a two story art center.

In an exciting move, Studios on the Park has also entered into a partnership with the City of Paso Robles resulting in the Festival of the Arts, taking place over Memorial Day weekend.

Studios on the Park, Inc. is a non profit organization dedicated to providing a creative, educational and transformational experience to enhance the understanding and appreciation of the visual arts. It has a commitment to make the creative process available to the public and offers its visitors a unique open studio environment.

Studios features artists working in a variety of media. It offers educational programs for children and adults and quality exhibitions by regional, national and international artists
