Friends of Hearst Castle and Studios on the Park are partnering to provide unforgettable art experiences to **middle and high school students** in Fall 2018.

Newspaper giant William Randolph Hearst envisioned “La Cuesta Encantada” as not just a retreat, but also a living museum, showcasing his superb European and Mediterranean art collection. His architect, Julia Morgan, blended hundreds of different art pieces throughout the breathtaking interior and grounds. The Hearst family gave this house and the art to the people of California. Students will have the opportunity to see Mr. Hearst’s museum-worthy collection during a special art focused guided tour. Then students will create artworks of their own on the castle’s outdoor terrace. A professional artist will teach perspective through a directed drawing lesson and then guide students in adding color to their masterpiece.

Through grants and donations, Kids Art Smart is able to cover the cost of all materials and the salary of the professional artist.

It is the teacher/school’s responsibility to:

- **Bring up to 52 middle and high school students for the class.**

Note: 52 students is the number limited by the Hearst Castle bus, which transports the students from the Visitor’s Center to the Hilltop and back. No other vehicle transportation is available.
